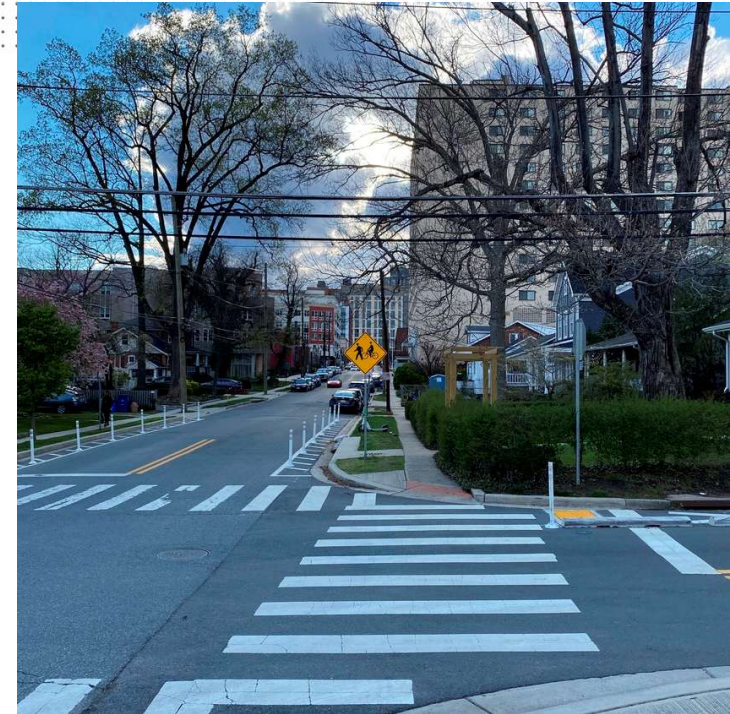

# Traffic Calming

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## Definition of Traffic Calming

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- Traffic calming is the combination of mainly physical measures that:
  - Reduce the negative effects of motor vehicle use,
  - Alter driver behavior; and
  - Improve conditions for non-motorized street users.

## Plan and Design Traffic Calming Measures

- Understand the context
- Educate and Involve Stakeholders
- “Starter Ideas” on how traffic calming measures could be applied to the specific context
- Align the effort with a broader vision for the area





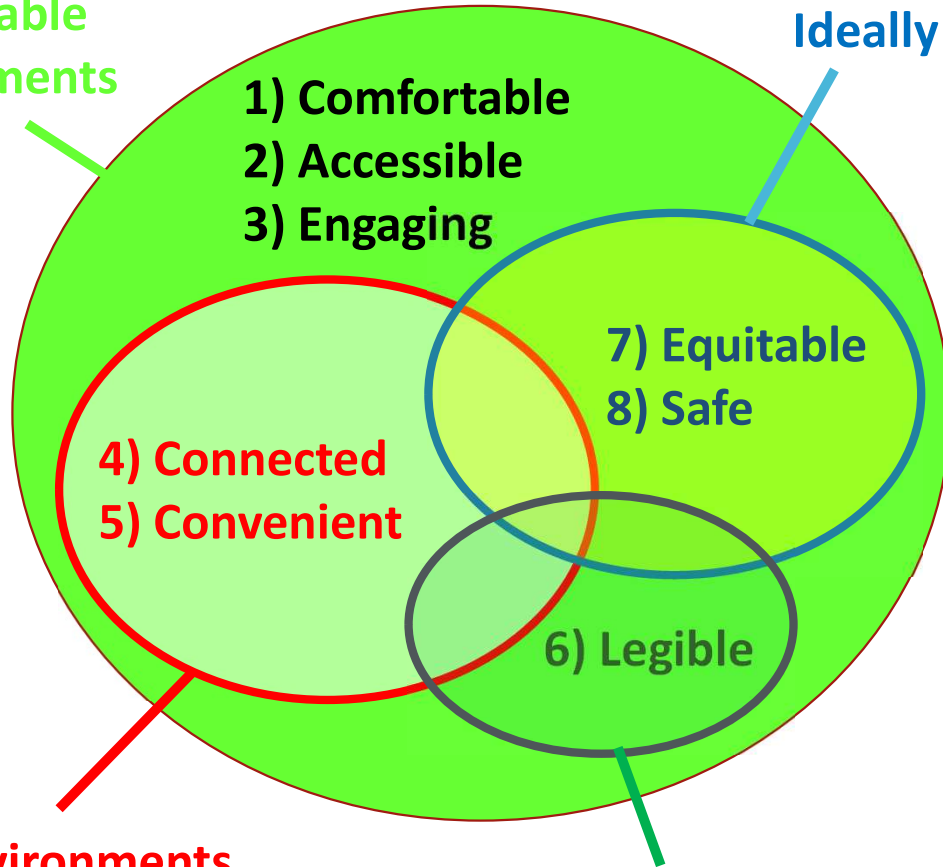


### Speed Management Measures by Street Type, Speed, and Context Classification

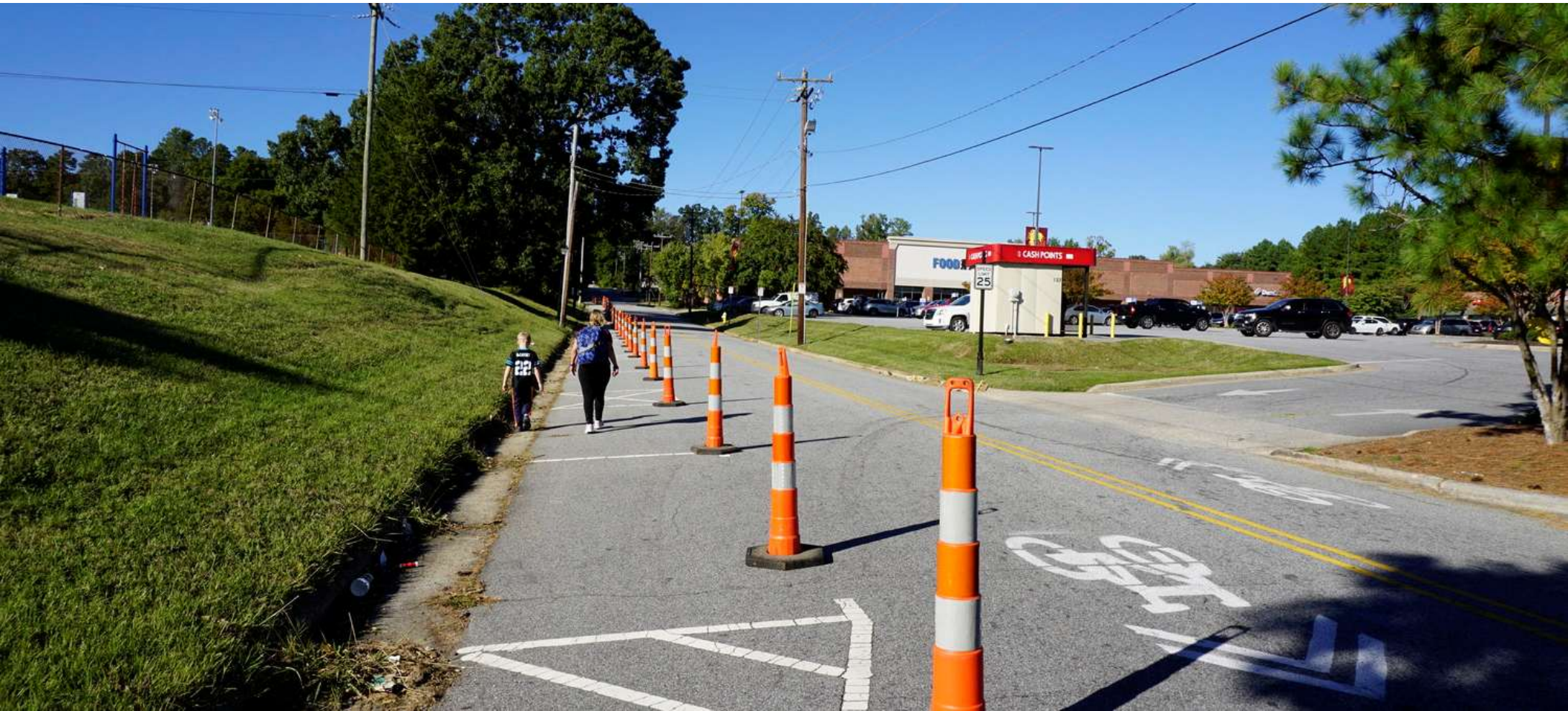
